At age 28, Rob Bell founded Mars Hill Bible Church in Michigan, and under his leadership it was one of the fastest-growing churches in America. In 2011 he was profiled in *Time Magazine* as one of their 100 most influential people. We'll read Rob Bell's first book, *Velvet Elvis: Repainting the Christian Faith*, as well as watch his NOOMA video series.

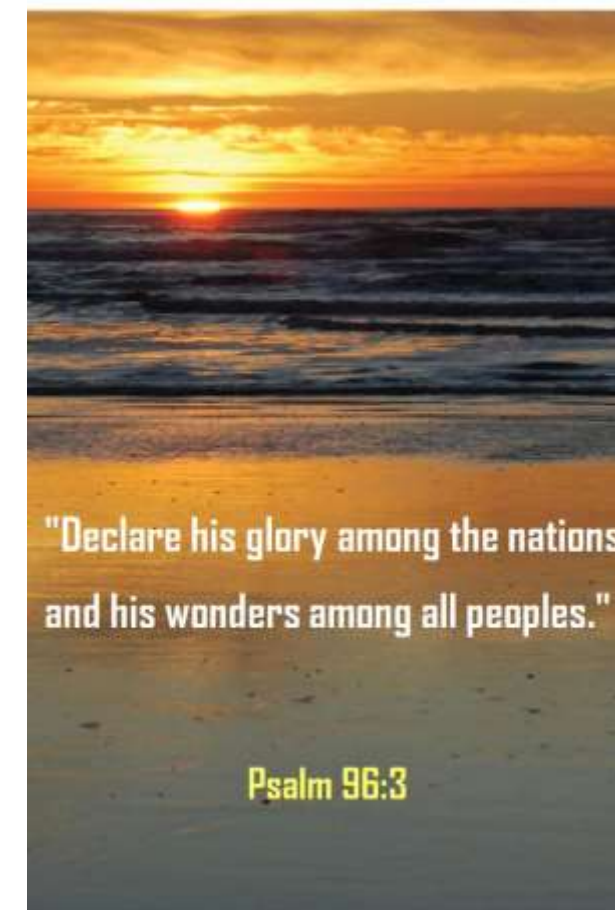

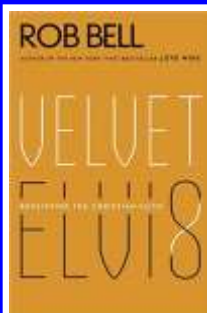

### New Cathedral Website: Being an Open Door

This week, we have launched a brand new website for the cathedral, designed especially for us by Membership Vision. This web hosting group works specifically in redesigning church websites and also recently won a web design Award of Merit from Episcopal Communicators at their national conference. The Membership Vision website platform allows us to tell the stories of our cathedral by raising up the voices of our community in new and exciting ways. Over the next weeks and months, you'll notice several changes around some of our communications. You'll especially see more from our social media, leading to more ways that you can share your experience of cathedral life with us. This leads to the most significant change to our website design: it is now directly linked to our Facebook and Twitter accounts. Any time a post is added to our Facebook page, or we send out a Tweet, it is automatically posted to our website as well. This vastly improves our capability of updating our website in real time, making it easier to keep our online information fresh and dynamic with any and all upcoming and current events here at the cathedral.

I encourage your feedback on what you would like to see on our website. Our streamlined layout should make finding sermons, livestreams, and anything else you may be looking for much more intuitive, although if all else fails, you can click the magnifying glass in the top right corner of the website and run a search for anything specific you may want to find. If that doesn't work, let us know! We'll continue to work with Membership Vision to make adjustments and improvements as needed to the website. This certainly beats having to figure it out ourselves, which is what Meredith Cataland and I have had to do in the past. Now that we actually have tech support for our website, we can be more confident about making changes.

So, other than to keep up with the times and make our website as user friendly as possible for everyone, why are we doing this? I think what Paul said to the Corinthians above is a good example. With most people these days, their first point of contact with any organization, let alone a church, is through their website. We bank online, shop online, socialize online, and the list goes on with everything that can be done online today. Quite simply, online is where the people are. So websites act as doors for people to go through to see what an organization, or even a church, is all about. Just as Paul was willing to engage with others in any way possible in order to spread the love of God, so we are called to do the same. It is our hope here at the cathedral that this new website will allow us to share the abundant life and blessings of the kingdom of God with others by being an inviting, open door for all.
