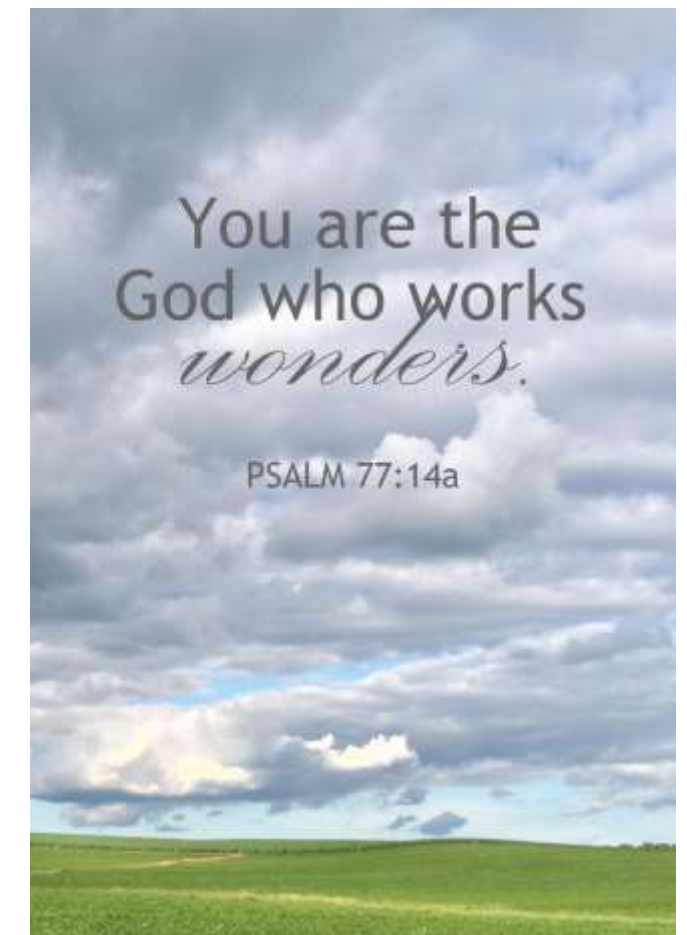

Habitat for Humanity—HabiJax Blitz Build

"A world where everyone has a decent place to live."

Whether you are building a concrete block house in Guatemala, or a frame house with siding in Jacksonville, being a Habitat volunteer is a rewarding experience; both for the satisfaction of seeing a family achieve their goal of a house of their own as well as seeing the

pride and sense of community that is developed in the process. Becoming a recipient of a habitat home is not an easy process. Families have to apply and be qualified, are given support in financial planning and put in 300 hours of "sweat equity" into their homes. In order to make the homes more affordable, volunteers do a portion of the labor, along with family members under the guidance and direction of the contractor. Although you can volunteer directly to assist with any house that Habitat is currently working on, there is an Episcopal Coalition made up of several local Episcopal churches, who give financial support as well as coordinate volunteers to work on houses over a one week period of time, several times a year. On some occasions, the teams renovate houses, and other times build new homes.

Recently, Habitat organized a "Blitz build" in which 12 new homes were built in the New Town area of Jacksonville. Eight volunteers from St. John's participated in the Blitz. The main structure of the house was completed by contractors and other licensed professionals. Volunteers completed jobs that did not require licensed work, such as siding, interior painting, and landscaping. Each organization worked on the same house during the week. Several volunteers work together on the task of the day, under the direction of the contractor. The day I volunteered, we were tasked to work on siding. After instruction in the proper way to install siding, teams of 3-4 volunteers started working on each side of the house in the morning. Together, we completed the job by noon. It was rewarding to see the house go from unfinished fiberboard to an exterior which was covered with siding, the color of which was chosen by the family.

I would encourage anyone to volunteer for a Habitat build. There are many opportunities to participate; from helping to make lunches, assisting the families in transitions into their homes, financial support, as well as building. Pride in one's home creates stronger neighborhoods and more productive citizens. Just as important is the satisfaction of doing for others, and appreciating the gifts that we have all been given.
